PURPOSE: To concretely consider what the H of SSH can contribute to Horizon Europe Pillar 2 applications and other interdisciplinary initiatives.

DESCRITION: There is broad consensus that interdisciplinary research is needed to help address the urgent challenges posed by environmental and sustainability dilemmas. Despite much good will, interdisciplinary initiatives continue to struggle to effectively integrate the insights and research practices of social science and humanities (SSH) scholarship in general, and of the humanities (H), in particular. Researchers with experience in interdisciplinary efforts nearly always agree that it is essential to begin working across different fields as early as possible in the project design process. But this is often difficult to do in practice, especially in the case of the humanities, where few outside of its disciplines have a vivid picture of what its different approaches might contribute to a given project or topic.

This workshop seeks to address this challenge in a novel way: by imagining what humanities scholars might bring to projects that are still early in their design phase. Three research groups - composed primarily of scholars from the natural and technical sciences - have generously agreed to put forward in-process project proposals so that we can engage in collective visioning: If humanities scholars were involved in these projects, what might they contribute? And how might the overall projects potentially be changed by such humanities inclusion?

The workshop's format follows from this new approach. It will begin with a presentation on SSH-inclusion in EU funding contexts and brief introductions to the three in-process research proposal ideas. Then, invited humanities researchers will serve as guides for imagining new kinds of SSH work packages and questions. All other researchers will be asked to serve as co-creators and dialogue partners during an interactive breakout session and a subsequent discussion.

Researchers from all disciplinary backgrounds and career stages are welcome to attend.
